### **Non Dwelling Burglaries**

Over the past week the rural Test Valley has been the target for several non dwelling burglaries on some of the large estates and business premises. Fuel, scrap metal, heavy plant and trailers are all items that have been stolen and again, I have no doubt that those responsible for these thefts are individuals who trawl across our area looking for easy targets.

Whether at your place of work or at home please consider the security of items around you, making sure they do not present themselves as easy pickings for these thieves.

You should add security markings (i.e. postcodes using specialist marker pens) to all items of value and ensure they are all locked away.

Trailers of all shapes and sizes appear to be sought after items and if you have one parked on your drive or in the garden then please ensure it is secure and, if possible, concealed from passers by. A hitch lock or wheel clamp are simple yet effective methods of restricting what can otherwise be an easy target.
